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### 12 EAP – English for Academic Purposes

#### INTRODUCTION

**Entry Level of English Language:** Stage 3 English Language Learning Progressions This course helps bilingual students with further development of their English while they maintain learning in their home languages. Target students are New Zealand-born, international and migrant bilingual students who are in Years 11, 12 or 13. The students will generally achieve Level 3 English Language standards and may attempt the new Level 3 English for Academic Purposes standards.

#### CONTENT AND SKILLS

Learning outcomes are from a range of curriculum learning areas e.g. Social Sciences, Health. There are also English language learning outcomes to prepare students for the academic language demands of mainstream subjects. Topics usually last for five weeks.

Students learn vocabulary and grammar concurrently with developing their reading, writing, speaking and listening in English. There is a focus throughout the course on research skills.

#### FUTURE PATHWAYS

This course is for students preparing for tertiary study.

#### PASIFIKA LANGUAGES STANDARDS

Students who understand Tongan, Cook Is Maori and Samoan can be supported in this class to achieve NCEA achievement standards in these languages. Other students may be assessed through the Pacific Studies standards.
